SPOTLIGHT ON BULGARIA

Bulgaria has earned a reputation as an inexpensive and exotic tourism destination year-round. Resorts are plentiful along spectacular beaches, and hikers and skiers love to tackle the peaks of four large and scenic mountain ranges. Bulgaria's ancient struggles and triumphs are the stuff of Byzantine epics, but it was the country's position on the losing side of World War I and II that defined its modern history. With significant territory lost, a ruined economy, and a populous in revolt, it fell under the influence of the Soviets and communism for much of the remainder of the 20th century.

Bulgaria held its first multiparty election since World War II in 1990 and entered the EU on January 1, 2007. Through significant amounts of bank lending, consumption, and foreign direct investment, the country grew at an annual rate of more than 6% from 2004 - 2008. Despite a favorable investment environment that offers low, flat corporate income taxes, problems with corruption in public administration and a high presence of organized crime have hindered the country's investment prospects and economic expansion. Additionally, the global financial crisis slowed domestic demand, resulted in a rise of unemployment, and subsequently slowed industrial production and capital inflows. The country's GDP growth has risen steadily since 2012 alongside a more stable government, a consolidation of the banking sector, and recent rise in exports, indicating the potential for moderate growth in the coming years

Rila Monastery (Guided)

A perfect day trip out of Sofia, combining spectacular scenery with history and culture. On the UNESCO World Heritage list and tucked away in the Rila mountains at 1150m above sea level, the Rila monastery was founded in the 10th century by the followers of the hermit monk St. John of Rila. The monastery became a powerful spiritual centre in the Middle Ages and kept alive the Bulgarian national spirit during the Ottoman rule. The Monastery is the undisputed crown jewel of Bulgarian tourism and the country's most important cultural and religious center. Each year it welcomes hundreds of thousands of visitors, tourists and pilgrims, alike. From the outside, it maintains its fortress-like appearance but once through the main gate, the visitor finds himself in a spacious cobbled courtyard surrounded by enchanting rows of balconies with a church in the centre. All of this is against the splendid natural backdrop of the Rila mountains. Unlike most churches built under Ottoman rule, this one is outwardly ornate, and the exterior arcades depict religious scenes in bright colours. Visitors are free to wander around the monastery, which still functions as such to date. Other points of interest include Hrelyo's tower, next to the church, the only original building dating back to 1335, the monastery kitchen with its huge, vaulted chimney and the museum, for which a fee is charged. – Entrance fees included

Boyana Film Studio Tour (Guided)

Boyana Film Studio, situated in Sofia, Bulgaria, is renowned for its contribution to Eastern European and international cinema. Boyana Church (Guided)

It offers visitors a comprehensive overview of Bulgaria's rich historical heritage and its evolution through various periods and civilizations. – *Entrance fees included*.
